Community Improvement Project Update



Our Board of Directors recently signed a bank loan to fund important improvements in our community, and has met with three contractors in order to set the construction schedule. The improvements will include replacement of asphalt streets, a new gate communication system, and the installation of pavers at the front entrance.

Details of this project are below:

- Work will begin after Labor Day with all asphalt work completed in four weeks

- The communication system and pavers will be installed two weeks after the asphalt work has been completed.

There will be times during replacement and repair of the asphalt, that landscape watering will need to be shut off; trash pick up and mail delivery will be somewhat limited, and access to and from the community will be redirected. Homeowners will be given adequate notice before traffic pattern and sprinkler shut off occurs.

In advance of project construction, homeowners are requested to trim plants and trees extending onto the pavement and stop any over spray of sprinkler water onto the payment.


In order to avoid damage to the new asphalt, homeowners are urged to be careful when turning onto the asphalt for up to **six months after the new asphalt has been applied**.
